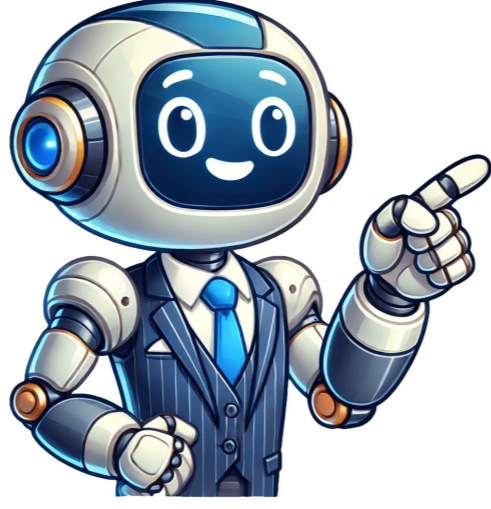

VicNet is the optional module that gives volunteers online access through the web or our mobile app. With VicNet, volunteers can check their schedules, sign-up for schedule openings, update their profile information, post their service, and receive messages from you—from any device. Use the mobile app to access their information. Check or maintain information such as their address, phone numbers, and email address. Check and print their schedule, sign-up for schedule openings, and alert you to times they cannot serve as scheduled. Post their hours, and view and print their past service information. Check the progress toward the completion of their mandatory service. Receive messages. Use the mobile app to access their volunteers' information. View and manage information for the volunteers assigned to their area. View and manage volunteer schedules for their area. VicNet works seamlessly with your Volgistics account, and you control the degree and kinds of access volunteers can have. You manage VicNet from the Setup area inside your Volgistics account. Volunteers and coordinators use a login name and password to access their information, and they can interact from any internet connected computer: at home, work, or on the road. Volunteers get to VicNet through a link on your own web site, and you can "brand" the service to match your site. If you have been managing your volunteer organization mainly through face-to-face communication and phone calls, you may be wondering why you need online volunteer software. As you grow, you will quickly discover why a reliable online volunteer management system is so important. In today's non-profit environments, online access for volunteer managers and their volunteers is critical. For efficiency purposes, allowing your coordinators to manage volunteers online is a must. Many volunteer organizations have a large number of volunteers, and each coordinator may be responsible for managing a considerable group at any given time. With the right online volunteer management system, coordinators can know at a moment's notice which volunteers they have access to and where they are located. Learn about the different types of VA ID cards and other Veteran ID options. A Department of Defense (DoD) Identification Card is used to show your military status and to get access to services at military bases. You may also use this card to get discounts offered to Veterans at many stores, businesses, and restaurants. If you have a DoD Identification Card, you don't need to request another type of photo ID card to prove you're a Veteran or to get retail or business discounts. You may be eligible if one of these descriptions is true for you. One of these must describe you: You're retired from the military, or You're on active duty, or You're in the National Guard, the Reserves, the Selected Reserves, or Inactive Ready Reserve Note: Depending on your status, the DoD issues either a Common Access Card (CAC) or a Uniformed Services ID Card (USID). For both types of DoD cards, you'll need to either be a sponsor or have a sponsor. When you're enrolled in VA health care, you get a Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) that you use to check in to your appointments at VA medical centers. You may also use this card to get discounts offered to Veterans at many stores, businesses, and restaurants. If you have a VHIC, you don't need to request another type of photo ID card to prove you're a Veteran or to get retail or business discounts. A Veteran ID Card (VIC) is a digital photo ID you can use to get discounts for Veterans at many stores, businesses, and restaurants. When you have this card, you won't need to carry around your military discharge papers or share sensitive personal information to get discounts. And you don't need to request another type of photo ID card to prove you're a Veteran or to get retail or business discounts. You may be eligible if you meet both of the requirements listed below. Both of these must be true: You served on active duty, in the Reserves, or in the National Guard (including the Coast Guard), and You received an honorable or general discharge (under honorable conditions) If you received an other than honorable, bad conduct, or dishonorable character of discharge, you're not eligible for a Veteran ID Card. If you have an uncharacterized or unknown discharge status, well have to verify your eligibility before we approve your application. At this time, all 50 states and Puerto Rico offer a Veteran designation (an identifying mark) printed on state-issued drivers licenses or IDs. The type of Veteran designation may vary from state to state. If you have a Veterans designation, you may be able to get discounts offered to Veterans at many stores, businesses, and restaurants. Most states ask you to provide a copy of your discharge papers (DD214 or other separation documents). Some states may require additional documents. Please check with your states Department of Motor Vehicles about what you need to apply for a Veterans designation for your state. You may already have an identification card that you can use to show you're a Veteran. But if you don't, you can apply for a VIC to get discounts offered to Veterans. A VIC is a photo ID you can use to get discounts offered to Veterans at many restaurants, hotels, stores, and other businesses. If you already have a Department of Defense Identification Card or a Veteran Health Identification Card, you don't need a VIC. Note: As of September 2022, all new Veteran ID Cards are digital. If you already have a physical Veteran ID Card, you can continue using it to get discounts. When you apply, be sure to have these on hand: Your Social Security number A digital (scanned) copy of your DD214, DD256, DD257, PHS1867, or NGB22 that you can upload. This could be in a .pdf, .jpeg, or .png file format. A copy of a current and valid government-issued ID, such as a drivers license, passport, or state-issued identification card. You'll also need a digital color photo of yourself from the shoulders up. The photo should follow all these standards: Show a full front view of your face and neck (with no hat, head covering, or headphones covering or casting shadows on your hairline or face), and Be cropped from your shoulders up (much like a passport photo), and Show you with your eyes open and a neutral expression, and Be taken in clothing you'd wear for a drivers license photo, and Be a square size and have a white or plain-color background (with no scenery or other people in the photo), and Show what you look like now (a photo taken sometime in the last 10 years), and Be uploaded as a .jpeg, .png, .bmp, or .tiff file Well check your eligibility and verify that: Your character of discharge meets eligibility requirements, and The ID you submitted (drivers license or passport) is valid, and The image you've chosen to appear on the card meets the photo requirements Then well send you an email letting you know the status of your application. If you have an unknown or uncharacterized discharge status, your application will take more time to process. (We may need to request your records from the National Personnel Records Center.) If you receive an email from us asking for additional information or evidence to process your application, you'll need to sign in to AccessVA and update your application. If you're eligible for a Veteran ID Card, well send you an email with your digital card attached. To request a new card, please send us an email. Email us at vetidcard@va.gov Well send you an email with your new digital Veteran ID Card attached. No, Your Veteran ID Card won't replace your Veteran Health Identification Card or your Department of Defense ID Card. You can use any of these forms of ID to get the same discounts: A Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC), or A Department of Defense (DoD) Identification Card either a Common Access Card (CAC) or Uniformed Services ID Card, or A state-issued drivers license or ID with a Veterans designation Note: If you already have one of these, you don't need a Veteran ID Card, but you can still apply for it if you'd like. You can't use your Veteran ID Card to: Prove your eligibility for any federal benefits, or Access military bases or installations, or Access military commissaries or exchanges, or Present as a form of identification at the airport, or Check into a VA hospital, or Show as proof of retirement from the Armed Forces, or Show as proof of wartime service to get a special license plate from the Department of Motor Vehicles This is a carousel with auto-rotating slides.
