To enter Ethiopia as a Sudanese citizen, follow these straightforward steps. Please note that migration services can request additional documents, such as return tickets and accommodation reservations. Ensure your passport is valid for at least six months after entry into Ethiopia. When arriving, present your passport to the immigration officer. Obtaining an entry stamp in your passport is equivalent to a visa. You are allowed a 90-day stay in Ethiopia. In order to visit Ethiopia, all countries are eligible for e-tourist-visas (www.evisa.gov.et), which can only be used at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport. Nationals from most African countries also have the option of receiving their tourist visas on arrival at the airport. These visa types include Algeria, Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo, DR Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Eswatini, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Ivory Coast, Lesotho, Liberia, Libya, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritania, Mauritius, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Rwanda, So Tom and Prncipe, Senegal, Somalia, South Africa, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania, Togo, Tunisia, Uganda, Western Sahara, and Zambia. Ethiopia also offers business visas for purposes such as conferences, foreign business employment, government work, journalist assignments, private firm visits, international organisation participation, and short-term government institution tasks. Tourist visa on arrival is available to nationals of Australia, Canada, the UK, the USA, and several EU countries. Sudanese citizens require an Ethiopian e-visa to enter the country legally and enjoy their trip without any trouble. The e-visa is completely processed online and linked with the applicant's passport. Sudanese must provide the following information and documents for their e-visa: personal info, date of birth, nationality, address, valid passport with 2 blank pages and 6-month validity, coloured passport size photographs, passport details, copy of hotel reservations, letter of invitation in case of staying with friends or family, and confirmed flight tickets. The main types of e-visas for Sudanese are tourist visa, business visa, single entry visa, multiple entry visa. The tourist visa allows citizens of Sudan into Ethiopia for travel purposes, valid for 30 days. The business visa allows Sudanese to enter Ethiopia for work-related activities like meetings or conferences. To apply for an Ethiopian e-visa, one must get an online application, read and fill out the form with correct details, attach digital copies of required documents, review the application, pay the required fee, track the status, and receive the approved e-visa within 3 days. Sudanese are eligible to get visas on arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport in Ethiopia. However, this visa is inconvenient compared to an e-visa, as it can get rejected by authorities on the spot. Documents required for Ethiopian visa on arrival include passport with minimum six months validity and two blank pages, passport size photographs, recent bank statement, and a letter of invitation. The following nations are eligible for visas on arrival in Ethiopia: Algeria, Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso.
